Nevada state board of nursing cna application

On April 1, 2020, Governor Sisolak issued an Emergency Directive 011 to temporarily waive the license requirement. The waiver applies to qualified providers who currently have a valid U.S. license in good condition in another state. Ineligible suppliers include those whose licenses have been revoked or voluntarily handed over as a result of a disciplinary proceeding. All people who wish to work under this directive must fill out this form and return it to the Nevada State Nursing Board. You are not required to get approval from the Nevada State Nursing Board, once you have submitted this form you are immediately eligible to start working under the directive. Please note that this is a waiver of the license; Therefore, you will not be issued a license in Nevada, but you can practice in Nevada once this form is submitted. You can practice in Nevada under this waiver, while Nevada is under a state of emergency only. FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS Is the Nevada State Board of Nursing open? Yes, we are open but closed to the public for walk-ins. Our Las Vegas and Reno offices are only open to the public for fingerprint services. I need to have an active CNA certificate to help with the pandemic in Nevada Yes, Nevada law requires that you have an active or certified license in order to practice as a nurse or CNA in Nevada. What is Emergency Directive 011? On April 1, 2020, Governor Sisolak issued an Emergency Directive 011 to temporarily waive the license requirements for the next: nurses, enrolled nurses of advanced internships, enrolled nurses, licensed practical nurses and nursing students. The waiver applies to qualified providers who currently have a valid U.S. license in good condition in another state. Ineligible suppliers include those whose licenses have been revoked or voluntarily handed over as a result of a disciplinary proceeding. This waiver of the license is only valid for the entire duration of the Emergency Declaration of 12 March 2020. All the people who under this directive they must fill in the Emergency License during the Declaration of Directive 011 of Emergency and return it to the State Board of Nursing of Nevada. If you want to apply for a temporary or permanent license or renewal in Nevada not in accordance with the directive, you can still submit your endorsement or examination application through the Nevada Nevada Nurse Should I have an active RN/LPN/APRN/CRNA license in Nevada to help with the pandemic in Nevada? No, for more information about the practice in accordance with Emergency Directive 011, see above. If you wish to apply for a temporary or permanent license or renewal in Nevada not in accordance with the directive, you can still submit your application through the Nevada Nursing Portal. Can I expedite my application? No, all applications are processed for the first time, for the first time served. We continue to process requests and support documents in about a week. If you meet the requirements, you will be granted a temporary license within one week from the date of receipt of the application and/or documentation. Is my temporary or permanent license/certificate expiring can I get an extension? For more information about the practice under Emergency Directive 011, see above. Yes, in accordance with Governor Sisolak Directive 010 all licenses and certificates that must expire during the state of emergency will be granted an extension. As the expiration date approaches, check your nursing portal account to determine if you've been granted an extension and verify the new expiration date. Please note that if you wish to submit your renewal application, you can do so through your nursing portal account within 60 days of the new expiration date. Is my license/certificate expired or inactive can I renew to help the pandemic? For more information about the practice under Emergency Directive 011, see above. Yes, if you want to renew your nursing license you can renew as long as you meet the current renewal requirements. The RN/LPNs must have practiced in the last five years and have completed 30 hours of continuous education credits and a unique four-hour bioterrorism course. If you want to renew your CNA certificate you must have practiced at least 40 hours in the previous two years and have completed 24 hours of continuous education credits. I am a nursing student, where can I take the NCLEX and how quickly can I take the exam? to submit an application and we must receive proof that you have graduated, and you must have paid the Vue person before an authorization is issued to try. Once you have issued your authorisation to try, you can schedule to take your exam in any Pearson Vue Vue test You can see all the test locations here: . Pearson Vue is continually adding test dates and sites, so if you were unable to schedule your exam on a satisfactory date, keep checking your site for updates and the ability to change your exam to a sooner date Where can I get my fingerprints captured? Yes, in accordance with Governor Sisolak Directive 010 all licenses and certificates that must expire during the state of emergency will be granted an extension. As the expiration date approaches, check your nursing portal account to determine if you've been granted an extension and verify the new expiration date. You can still complete the application process to obtain your permanent license. Please note that the Nevada State Nursing Board accepts electronic transcripts sent directly from your nursing program and emailed to nursingboard@nsbn.state.nv.us. These transcripts can usually be requested online without having to contact your nursing program. If you are a graduate of a program in the United States, you can also submit a copy of your diploma showing that you were awarded a degree in Nursing. I am an endorsement applicant and my temporary license is expiring because I have not submitted my license verification, can I get an extension of my temporary license? For more information about the practice under Emergency Directive 011, see above. Yes, in accordance with Governor Sisolak Directive 010 all licenses and certificates that must expire during the state of emergency will be granted an extension. As the expiration date approaches, check your nursing portal account to determine if you've been granted an extension and verify the new expiration date. You can still complete the application process to obtain your permanent license. So far, 54 states are participating in electronic verification that is completed through nursys.com. To find out if your state participates in the verification of nursing licenses please do here: I am a new nursing graduate and my NCLEX exam was cancelled, how does this affect my application? If the exam has been cancelled, you should have been granted an extension through Pearson Vue. The application will remain in force during this extension period. Please contact Pearson Vue directly for detailed information on the authorisation to test the expiration date and reschedule the exam. You can find additional information about your NCLEX exam here: I am a new graduate: can I work as a graduate nurse to deal with the pandemic? Yes, if you have been issued provisional leave by the Nevada State Nursing Board (or any other Nursing Board, in accordance with Emergency Directive 011, please see above) you can work as a graduate nurse under the direction of a licensed nurse. In order to be eligible for a temporary permit in Nevada you must have applied to the Board and we must receive proof that you have completed your nursing program. Once you meet the requirements, you will be issued a provisional permit that can be verified in the nursing portal account or the Board's licensing verification system. I am a nursing student; can I work as a CNA to help the pandemic? You can work as a CNA only if you have been issued a CNA certificate by the Nevada State Nursing Board. Nursing students can apply for a CNA certificate per exam once they have completed a university nursing basics course. They must do and pass the ANC state exam and complete a background check before they can be granted a CNA certificate. I am an ANC student and have not completed my course nor have I passed the state exam; can I work as a CNA to help the pandemic? You can work as a CNA only if you have been issued a CNA certificate by the Nevada State Nursing Board. However, CNA students can work as a trainee nursing assistant. The Board will not issue any certificate or license for nursing assistants, this designation is given to students by the facility for their work. To.
